The Sibby

Play is governed by the USGA Rules of Golf, and the following local conditions:

Ball: The ball will be played as it lies. Triple bogey max for boys and girls.

<u>COURSE MARKINGS</u>: Lines take precedence over stakes.

Out of Bounds (OB): White stakes and/or lines.

Penalty Areas: Defined by red or yellow stakes and paint.

Ground Under Repair (GUR): White painted circles.

Newly Placed Sod: Seams where pieces of new sod come together will be played as ground under repair.

Bluegrass Sod: Areas that were previously "KEEP OUT" areas are now in play and must be played.

MONUMENTS & ROCK WALLS: Are deemed to be integral parts of the golf course.

STONES IN BUNKERS: Stones in bunkers MAY be removed.

Stipulated Round: In the event of inclement weather stopping play, 9 holes will be used for scoring as an official round.

<u>Streets:</u> All street/roadways are deemed Out of Bounds.

Model Local Rule E-5 is in effect (optional): "When a player's ball has not been found or is known or virtually certain to be out of bounds, the player may proceed as follows rather than proceeding under stroke and distance. For two penalty strokes, the player may take relief by dropping the original ball or another ball in this relief area (see Rule 14.3):

- a. Ball Reference Point: The point where the original ball is estimated to have:
 - Come to rest on the course, or
 - Last crossed the edge of the course boundary to go out of bounds.
- b. Fairway Reference Point: The point of fairway of the hole being played that is nearest to the ball reference point, but is not nearer the hole than the ball reference point.

<u>Coaches</u>: Are allowed to help players in all aspects of the round in order to promote fast play. This includes help with decision making and giving advice.
